## October Outreach Featuring Water to Thrive

October is the perfect month to highlight our congregation's involvement with Water To Thrive. Water To Thrive started from an Adult Forum Study at Triumphant Love Lutheran Church in Austin, TX. They were focusing on world hunger and poverty and came to the conclusion that having clean water was the very first step in solving those problems. From that small study group, Water To Thrive, a 501©(3) organization was started.

In the winter of 2016, we attended the Church of the Holy Trinity, a ELCA church in Kona, Hawaii. Ed Scharlau from Triumphant Lutheran Church gave a presentation on Water To Thrive. The Holy Spirit really moved us, and we knew that we had to bring the message to our congregation. I must admit, public speaking is one of my least favorite things to do and I had a battle within myself, not wanting to speak, but knowing that I had to do it.

Due to other circumstances in our lives that year, we were not able to do a presentation to the congregation until October. Our congregation funded three wells that year and has gone on to fund 20 wells and is getting close to our 21<sup>st</sup> well. When the last few well projects are completed this year, our congregation will be proving fresh clean water to minimum of 9,318 people, but it is always three to four

times that amount. This means that girls will be able to attend school, women will have more time to care for their homes and money won't have to be spent on medicine for water born illnesses.

This picture is from our 17<sup>th</sup> well that is in the Kayunga District of Uganda. A group of W2T travelers visited this site. They arrived at the site as the drilling crew had just started the pump test for the new bore hole ...the drilling had been completed the day before when the aquifer was reached at about 240 feet deep. The pump test determines the amount of water flow from the aquifer. While they were there, the first several readings indicated a capacity of over 900 gallons per hour, capable of filling over 150 jerry cans in an hour! As you can see, the community was already benefiting from the water being pumped out during the test.
